Professor Mike Daube was Deputy Chair of the Australian National Preventative Health Taskforce that recommended plain packaging of tobacco products. Mike is uniquely qualified to talk to Australia's experience of both dealing with the opposition to plain packaging and the benefits this has brought.

Professor Mike Daube is Professor of Health Policy at Curtin University, Western Australia, where he is Director of the Public Health Advocacy Institute. Prof Daube is President of the Australian Council on Smoking and Health and was previously President of the Public Health Association of Australia; he was Western Australia's first



Director General of Health from 2001 - 2005.

Prof Daube has received numerous honours for his work, including the American Cancer Society's Luther Terry Distinguished Career Award. In 2014, Prof Daube was made an Officer of the Order of Australia (AO) in recognition of his distinguished service to medicine, particularly public health policy and reform, through advisory roles with leading national and international organisations, and youth.
